- Pits, scabs, extensive redness, or swelling around a wound


#### GASTROINTESTINAL

The event was virtually graced by various Union Ministers and our Honorable Prime Minister of the Nation. Prime Minister Narendra Modi addressed the World Environment Day event and also interacted with the farmers from Maharashtra, Gujarat, and Uttar Pradesh on ethanol and biogas use. PM also encouraged farmers of the nation to indulge in Organic Farming to maintain soil fertility. The Prime minister also stated that farmers should focus on diverse farming to save our 'Mother Earth'. He also said that 'Till 2014, we used to blend just 1% ethanol but now it has been increased to 8.5%. The Oil Marketing companies have bought Rs 21,000 crore ethanol and most of this money has gone to our farmers.

He also stated that Ethanol is being produced by the Fermentation of Biowaste of crops, and this ethanol will be bought by the Oil Marketing Companies directly





from the farmers of the nation and used in Biofuel preparation. Through this event it was clearly provoking that we should Recreate, Reimagine, Restore our Ecosystem.

## SCIENTIFIC WRITING

### **-A REVIEW ON 2-DEOXY-D-GLUCOSE**

No one knew that pandemic would last so long and would hit us hard, it has been quite 14 months since the COVID-19 outbreak. the government has come up with several ways to forestall the spread by the employment of masks, lockdown in Containment Zones, and COVID-19 vaccination. New interventions and discoveries are being made to combat the COVID-19. One in all the among is Anti-COVID Drug 2-DG (2-deoxy-D-glucose), it had been developed during a joint project by DRDO (Defence Research and Development Organisation) and Dr. Reddy's Laboratories.

It has been approved by the Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) as an adjunct therapy. On May 17, 2021, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh Garu launched DRDO's 2-DG calling it - 'A new ray of hope in these challenging times. According to government reports, clinical research data reveals that the substance aids in the speedier recovery of patients hospitalized with COVID-19 and reduces their use of supplementary oxygen. This drug is alleged to come back within the sort of a powder-like substance in sachets which should be dissolved into the water before its administration.





The mechanism of this drug is selectively accumulated within the virus-infected cells and arrest the expansion of the virus by stopping viral synthesis and energy production.

Guidelines on the usage of 2DG Drugs in COVID-19 therapy:

- 2-DG should be prescribed early by the doctor. It is prescribed for up to 10 days and also the recipients will be both moderate to severely affected covid patients.
- The medicine has been approved for 'emergency usage,' and it can be utilized as a supplement to the quality process employed in the treatment of covid patients.
- 2-DG has not yet been tested on patients with uncontrolled diabetes, severe cardiac problems, ARDS, severe hepatic and renal impairment. Hence extra caution must be maintained.
- Lactating and pregnant women shouldn't be prescribed with 2-DG and also the same applies to people below the age of 18.

In most areas pharmacists are the primary point of contact with the health system for those with health-related concerns or in need of knowledge and reliable advice. Community pharmacists have undertaken the responsibility of informing and educating the general public. Additionally to COVID-19 related roles they supply essential Public services to the entire population through the availability of medicines and Pharmaceutical care.

According to initial reports, this truly is claimed to own the potential to be a game-changer within the battle with COVID-19 and help mitigate the risks and preventing the spread of disease, reducing the mortality rates.

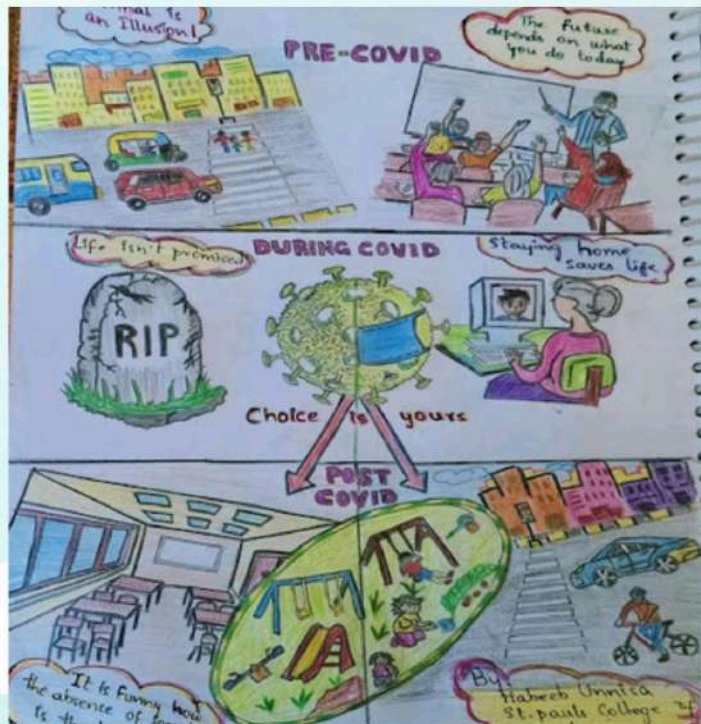
