






### **IPA-SF ACTIVITIES**



#### SERUM CREATININE

#### NORMAL RANGE

MEN: 0.9 to 1.3 mg/dL WOMEN: 0.6 to 1.1 mg/dL



#### ABNORMALITIES

- Low Serum creatinine levels may be a sign of liver disease, muscle disease, excess water loss, etc.
- High Serum creatinine levels may be a sign of drug toxicity, kidney infection, diabetes, high blood pressure, heart diseases.

Your doctor may suggest a creatinine blood test to assess your creatinine levels if you show signs of kidney disease. These symptoms include: fatigue and trouble sleeping, a loss of appetite, swelling in the face, wrists, ankles, or abdomen, lower back pain near the kidneys, changes in urine output, etc.

#### NORMAL RANGE

Men- 13.5 to 17.5 g/dl Women-12.0 to 15.5 g/dl

#### ABNORMALITIES

- Low Hb levels may be a sign of Different types of anemia, Iron deficiency, Liver diseases, Cancer, and other diseases.
- High Hb levels may be a sign of Lung disease, Heart disease, Polycythemia vera, etc.

Your doctor may suggest the test if you have signs and symptoms of anemia, which include weakness and dizziness, or any other inherited blood disorder.

#### SGOT

#### FULL FORM

Serum glutamic-oxaloacetic transaminase

#### NORMAL RANGE

8-45 Units/L



#### ABNORMALITIES


 Higher levels of SGOT indicate liver damage and damage to other organs like muscles, heart, brain, and kidneys.


Your doctor may suggest this test if you are experiencing symptoms like fatigue, weakness, a loss of appetite, nausea, vomiting, swelling of your abdomen, yellow skin or eyes, which is called jaundice, dark urine.





Topics covered included detailed information about covid vaccinations, mucormycosis(black fungus), candidiasis(white fungus), abnormality check of various laboratory investigations like hematological tests, renal function tests, hepatic function tests and electrolytes along with innovative crossword puzzles to challenge the knowledge of the public. The information provided included the normal ranges of the various laboratory investigations, indications in case of abnormalities along with characteristic clinical presentations in which the tests are advised.









# AWARENESS

### SARCOMA AWARENESS MONTH-JULY












### WORLD HEPATITIS DAY-28th JULY












### WORLD HEART DAY(29th SEPT)

### WORLD NATURE CONSERVATION DAY(28th JULY)




### **INDEPENDENCE DAY (15th AUG)**








### **INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE (21st SEPT)**




### WORLD PHARMACIST DAY (25th SEPT)
